# Iron Smelting in the Irthing Gorge

Two small piles of iron slag have been spotted by Grant Armstrong in the Irthing Gorge near the Spa Hotel.

This came as a surprise to me, as I have been interested in the history of this estate for a long time, and never found any reference to smelting there. After some research, aided by Steve Rozario, it seems most likely that these are evidence of bloomeries, an ancient, small-scale method of extracting iron which was practised until the industrial revolution and the invention of blast furnaces made them obsolete.

A possible source of ore might have been bog iron from marshy fields and chalybeate or iron-rich springs, using fuel from charcoal which is likely to have been produced in the woods. All fairly speculative – comments welcome!



### Regarding the future of St Mary Magdalene, Gilsland's Parish Church

Gilsland church currently has 2 services a month with a congregation of 3 or fewer. Our Vicar, Angela Hughes, has care of 4 churches, the people of 3 parishes and 3 C of E schools, all of which she visits most weeks. She lives in Lanercost Priory, is not paid a salary and works 3 days a week.

#### Who pays for the running and upkeep of a church?

People who give money to that church. There is no money paid to parish churches by the Church of England, the government or any other organisation. In our case, all the costs of the church are paid for by five households who give regularly and, in addition, occasional small donations placed in the plate. Since the start of covid, occasional donations have dropped dramatically. Some money is paid to Gilsland church for weddings (very rare occurrences) and funerals (fortunately also infrequent). There have been occasional grants of money towards the upkeep of the churchyard made by the three parish councils but in no year has this covered the actual cost.

In the last 10 years, we've spent £31,000 on necessary repairs, paid for by a bequest fund which is diminishing rapidly. Last year there was a running cost deficit of £2k which had to come from this fund. This situation cannot go on for much longer.

#### Keeping the church safe and running

There is a considerable amount of work involved in maintaining and running the church which is shouldered by the members, currently three.

#### Is the church needed anymore?

Can we justify all this work and money for a congregation of just two or three days a month?

#### What are the consequences of Gilsland church closing?

It would be put up for sale. Part of the churchyard not already used for burial would have to be used to give vehicular access. The church would no longer be available for funerals. Burials could continue but space would be very limited. If there is no sale the building would be demolished.


### What could keep Gilsland church going?

- More people worshipping there
- More people helping with the work (more about this in the next issue)
- More money so we break even
- More people just visiting, spending time there and signing the book to let us know the church is of value

#### And the future?
