It is with great pleasure and excitement that GCBSL can announce that they have been successful in their Community Ownership Fund bid. The funding body, which is part of the UK Government Levelling Up Agenda, said: "We are delighted to inform you that your application has been successful, and to approve in principle the award of a COF grant of £198,658 capital funding and £17,181 revenue funding to Save Our Samson to help save your treasured community asset and support the ambitions of your community". The Share Pledges and Donations have now reached £141,455 from 476 supporters.

Christian Aid 's update on their work among all the peoples affected by the war states, "Our established partners in Gaza are responding as best they can, under intense pressure. They're responding with medical relief and community-led initiatives such as food, shelter, sanitation and cash. This includes building mobile bathrooms in four shelters to working with local farmers to get fresh vegetables for families that have left their homes to escape airstrikes. However, it's extremely dangerous to move around, and supplies of essentials are running perilously low."

Let us hope and pray for an immediate ceasefire so that humanitarian aid can reach all those who need it.
