A NEW CREATIVE HUB FOR GILSLAND AREA



Amanda and Kit of Green Croft Arts have secured funding to create The Threshing Barn as an accessible creative hub offering arts and wellbeing activities for the community and visitors to Hadrian's Wall. Work is well under way with a new roof, foundations, insulation and flooring, windows and doors, a water treatment plant and an accessible toilet. When completed in January 2025, the activity space will have high ceilings, a semi-sprung wooden floor suitable for physical activity and doors out to the garden with access to Hadrian's Wall National Trail and views of Walltown Crags. The social space will be home to a small gallery which will show a carousel of exhibitions over the year, a small kitchen and seating area.

The grand opening is on Saturday 11th and Sunday 12th January when Kit and Amanda will be opening the doors on both days to offer free drop-in arts, creative and wellbeing activities. Information will be available about the regular classes and workshops, artist residencies and exhibitions that are planned for 2025. 


