RECIPE OF THE MONTH - CREAMY CURRIED PARSNIP SOUP

Ingredients

Ix Medium Onion, peeled and chopped 500gm Parsnips, topped, tailed, peeled and chopped 300gm Potato, peeled and chopped 2tbsp Vegetable Oil 1x 400ml Can of Coconut Milk 2x Vegetable Stock Cubes ½ tsp Garlic Granules, 1 Heaped tsp Medium Curry Powder

1/4 tsp Chilli Flakes, 1/2 tsp Paprika, 1/2 tsp Turmeric (optional)

Method

- Put a kettle of water on to boil.
- 2. In a 3 litre saucepan over a low to medium heat, heat the oil and cook the chopped onion until soft and translucent.
- 3. Add the garlic and spices, cook briefly whilst stirring.
- 4. Add the stock cubes, chopped parsnip and potato and the coconut milk, top off with boiling water.
- 5. Bring to low boil and simmer for 30-40 mins or until the vegetables are totally soft.
- 6. Allow to cool then puree with a stick blender or in a jug blender. (add a little more hot water if required to ease blending)
- 7. Pass the soup through a fine sieve into a clean saucepan, adjust consistency with hot water to your liking. Season to taste with salt and white pepper.

Reheat as required. Great served with warm Naan bread. Will keep well refrigerated or frozen.
