

RECIPE OF THE MONTH - DOUBLE CHEESE BISCUITS

Ingredients

- 100gms Plain Flour
- 100gms Soft 'Block' Salted Butter
- 30gms Grated Mature Cheddar Cheese
- 20gms Grated Parmesan Cheese
- ½ tsp Mustard Powder
- ½ tsp Smoked Paprika
- ½ tsp Rosemary finely chopped if fresh, rubbed between the fingers if dried
- 1/4 tsp white pepper
- Add salt to your preference if using unsalted butter

Method

- 1. Combine everything in a mixing bowl apart from the butter.
- 2. When the ingredients are evenly mixed add the soft butter, gently rub and knead together to form a soft pastry like dough.
- 3. Lay out a length of cling film of about 50cm.
- 4. Shape the dough into an even thickness sausage shape lengthways on the cling film.
- 5. Roll the dough in the film and twist the ends in opposite directions to bring the dough together in a firm even sausage, Chill in the refrigerator for at least 30 mins or store until ready to bake.
- 6. To bake, set the oven 180c (160c Fan). Unwrap the dough and with a sharp knife cut onto discs 3-4 mm thick.
- 7. Lay the discs spaced apart on a tray lined with baking parchment, brush each disc with a little milk and bake for 12-15 minutes.
- 8. Allow to cool completely before lifting with a palette knife and storing in an air tight container. They won't need storing for long, they are very morish!

FUNDING TO SUPPORT RURAL COMMUNITIES

NFU Mutual Charitable Trust is offering grants for organisations working in agriculture, rural development, and insurance across the UK to deliver projects and activities across one or more of the Trust's main objectives:

- To advance the education of the public using research and the dissemination of information concerning agriculture.
- To advance the education of young people within rural areas.
- To relieve poverty within rural areas.
- To promote the benefit and social welfare of inhabitants of rural communities by associating together with the inhabitants and local authorities, voluntary and other organisations to advance education and leisure.
- To promote research into agricultural-associated activities.
- To advance the education of the public using research and the dissemination of information concerning insurance.

Priority will be given to larger initiatives that would have a significant impact on rural communities, as well as initiatives in the areas of education of young people in rural areas, relief of poverty within rural areas, and support for the next generation of farmers.

Funding is at the discretion of the Trust. However, most grants fall within the range of £1,000 to £50,000. Trustees meet twice a year to consider applications, typically in June and November. The next deadline for applications is 23 May 2025.
