AND GILSLAND HAS A NEW VICAR

Thank you to everyone for welcoming us to this benefice and Mission Community. We have had quite a journey to get here and at the same time feel like we have arrived back at home.

I first felt a call to ministry when I was teenager; I had an experience of God that blew me away and convinced me that I should use my life in his service. I was not a saint from that time forward but I have felt God guiding me through the path that I have taken. Having been born in London I went to study history at the University of Wales and met my wife Jo at a Drama Society rehearsal. We fell in love and married at the grand old age of 21. We spent two years in Bristol and after working at a bank for a while the Church of England accepted me for ordination and sent me for training in Oxford.

Jo was born in Kendal so we did a mid-course placement in Cumbria. Bishop Graham Dow offered me a curacy and we moved to Cockermouth where our first two children Jack and Kate were born. The benefice at that time had two town churches and two rural churches so I had lots of experience of different types of church and community. Three years later I was appointed to be vicar of Stanwix, a more suburban church where we saw significant growth and our third son Tom was born. It was a home birth six days before Christmas so he used to tell people he was born underneath the Christmas tree. Whilst in Stanwix I also served as a Chaplain to the forces in the Army Reserve.

After seven years we felt that we wanted to try to work where people were in most need so I accepted a posting to Rio De Janeiro to work with the English speaking church. Three years later we moved to Canada and four years after that, back to Dalston in Cumbria.

That's a slightly whistle-stop tour of our journey but as I said, we feel like we have arrived home. I was not born in Cumbria but I do love it and although we have moved around a lot we always maintained a base in Halton Lea Gate, so although I still have much to learn about this area we have more experience of it than we might have done otherwise. I am really looking forward to getting stuck in to my new role here. I truly believe that the local church is the hope of the world and that the Kingdom of God can grow in this place. We just need to be faithful to the gospel and God will grow his church here. We are really looking forward to getting to know everyone here and getting stuck in to working with the community. RECIPE OF THE MONTH - DARK CHOCOLATE TART

For the chocolate pastry

- 110gm plain flour
- 75gm cubed butter
- 1 heaped dessert spoon of good quality cocoa powder
- 1 heaped dessert spoon of icing sugar
- 1 egg yolk
- 1-2 tablespoon of cold water
- 1. Sift the flour, cocoa and icing sugar together to combine then place in a food processor with the butter and egg yolk.
- 2. Blend to a 'breadcrumb' stage, then gradually add the cold water as required to form a soft dough. Wrap in cling film and chill for 30 minutes.
- 3. Line an 8-9 inch flan tin with the pastry (retain any excess). Chill.
- 4. Blind bake the pastry case for 15mins, remove the blind filling, use the reserved pastry to seal any cracks and then bake for a further 10mins. Leave to cool in the tin.

For the filling

- 280gms good quality dark chocolate
- 100mls milk
- 180mls double cream
- 2 Large beaten eggs
- 1. Set the oven to 180c gas MK 5
- 2. Melt the chocolate in a bowl over hot water, or carefully in a microwave.
- 3. Bring the milk and cream to a rising boil, cool for a moment and then whisk onto the eggs, pass through a fine sieve onto the melted chocolate, combine well without creating too many bubbles.
- 4. Place the pastry case on the oven shelf, fill with chocolate mix right to the top.
- 5. Slide the shelf in, allow the oven temp to recover for a minute or so then turn the oven OFF and leave the door closed for at least 50mins.
- 6. Remove from the oven and chill until firm then remove from the tin.

Decorate to taste. Drizzle with white chocolate? Top with whipped cream and soft fruits or nuts? Serve with a fruit coulis or ice cream?

The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll & Mr Hyde + The Body Snatcher - Northumberland Theatre Company

As he travelled, the journey itself provided inspiration, stories, perspectives and soundscapes for what will be a new collection of songs to be written and recorded in late Summer/Autumn 2025. Each night along the way he performed a series of concerts on the theme of pilgrimage to connect with local communities and explore ideas around journeying and passing through. This Autumn Gareth performs some special gigs in intimate spaces to preview some of the new material and revisit the ideas he encountered in the 'land of the far horizon' and along the pathways of 'no ordinary county". The gigs will also feature some of his other work and collaborations.

The artwork for the project will be designed by Fatcalf Design incorporating themes from the beautiful work of talented Northumberland artist Rebecca Vincent. Once recorded the new songs will be presented in a beautiful book/album with pictures from the journey, lyrics and reflections to be released in early 2026. The work will be performed back along the route where the songs were 'born' in Summer 2026 and toured further afield in late Summer/Autumn 2026.
